## Dear colleagues,

I want to let you know of a relaxation of the schedule for completion of the two tasks that Bill Webster communicated at the last COD meeting.

You will recall that, at that meeting, we discussed with you two requests related to faculty workload issues:

(1) A request to estimate the number of ladder rank faculty available to teach for the current academic year (2003-04) and a prognosis of the same data for 2004-05; and a list of the primary undergraduate courses offered in the college, division or school by each department in the fall and spring semesters.

(2) A request by the Office of the President to classify all courses offered in the UC System into one of 18 new instructional activity types.

Because of workload considerations for you and your chairs, we will defer the data request in item 1 until after the course classification project is completed. In the interim, we will prepare a clear set of instructions and requested deliverables to send to you later in the spring semester.

Because of the urgent deadline set by the Office of the President, we have assigned the highest priority to taking action on item 2. As a result, we will email soon a request directly to your chairs asking them to classify the courses offered in their departments according to the proposed 18 new classifications of faculty activity types. (A sample copy of my request is appended to this message.) This request has been configured as a simplified data entry process that chairs or their assistants should be able to complete without too great a time investment.

As part of an initiative to improve the way in which the University reports faculty instructional activities to the State Legislature and to provide a better means for understanding faculty instructional activities Systemwide, the Office of the President has proposed a new system of reporting these activities. We are seeking your assistance in the first step of the new process, which involves the classification of all undergraduate, graduate, and professional courses offered by your instructional unit into one of 18 classifications or Faculty Instructional Types.
