• The annual Pac-12 Spring Academic Honor Roll has been announced, and Cal had 155 student-athletes across 13 sports make the list. That was the second-most in the conference. To be eligible for the recognition, student-athletes must have a cumulative grade-point average of 3.3 or above and served at least one year of residence at the institution.

• Pitcher Paulshawn Pasqualotto of Cal's baseball team was selected in the 12th round of the 2023 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft by the Minnesota Twins. The Bears have now had 23 players drafted in the six years Mike Neu has served as Cal's head coach.
