Athletics

- <u>Campus announced on Sept. 1</u> that Cal Athletics will join the Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) beginning with the 2024-25 academic year. The decision came against the backdrop of significant conference realignment in recent years. The ACC is consistently ranked as the top academic major college conference in the country
- Cal's men's rowing program received a \$10 million commitment from the T. Gary and Kathleen Rogers Family Foundation, in partnership with Friends of Cal Crew. The Rogers Family has offered a \$5 million matching challenge, which will provide a 1:1 match for every new gift of pledge to endowments that benefit the program.
- Football student-athlete Matthew Cindric has been named to the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team, which recognizes student-athletes for exemplary community impact.
- Cal Athletics held its annual National Championship Week, honoring its national champions from the
 previous year. Men's Water Polo, Men's Swimming & Diving and Men's Rowing were each recognized
 for winning national titles during the 2022-23 school year it was the second consecutive national
 crown for each team. Chancellor Christ held a reception at the University House and the teams were
 honored during the football game against Arizona State.
- Cal's women's basketball team hosted its fourth annual "Race For Change" at Lake Merritt in Oakland. The event is part of a nationwide initiative originally started by UC San Diego's women's basketball program as a way to address racial equality. Cal's Race For Change raised funds for the athletic department's Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, Belonging and Justice office, and featured an appearance by Dr. John Carlos – the former track & field athlete who displayed the Black Power salute on the podium at the 1968 Summer Olympics in Mexico City.
